Road Work Ahead...and Behind

The first two weeks of July work began, expanding a portion of the North road, mainly to make it easier for first responders, vehicle recovery, and contractors as well as improving the sightlines. It's still a work in progress, and is a tad unsightly, for now. In the months ahead more rocks and gravel will be added to build up the voids created by the larger rocks we placed in the ground.

At the 90-degree right turn area on the North road we pushed back some boulders /rocks in order to improve the drainage and sightlines around this corner.



We also tried some cold pack asphalt on portions of Bigley hill on the North road in order to stabilize / firm up some ground there. We will monitor how well it holds up to the car, truck, service vehicle traffic and the weather. This is a stopgap measure until we can undertake a proper fix of the hill.

Road Grading: All Leech Lake roads were graded on the second week of July. We added 180 ft of new gravel on the North road.

Road edge brush clearing: In the third week of July a service provider was onsite to cut back the brush and grasses at our road edges. It was not their best work, and some issues around job quality on the North road were encountered. We noted these to the service provider who made amends, corrected the minor problems their work caused and reduced their invoice.

The 16th Annual Leech Lake Bug Count A Big Success!

The benthic monitoring (bug count) held on Sunday July 21 was a great success. More than 20 Leech Lakers were guided by Maggie Dechert, a District of Muskoka environmental technician, in the counting of insect life present in lakewater samples that she and Rick McCoy gathered earlier in the morning. This assessment of the bugs living in the lake will tell us important things about the health of our water. Big thanks to Valerie & Rick McCoy (1037 North) for hosting, and volunteers Shelley & Vaughn Bumstead (1011 North) and Leslie Wood (1173 North).
